Preamble

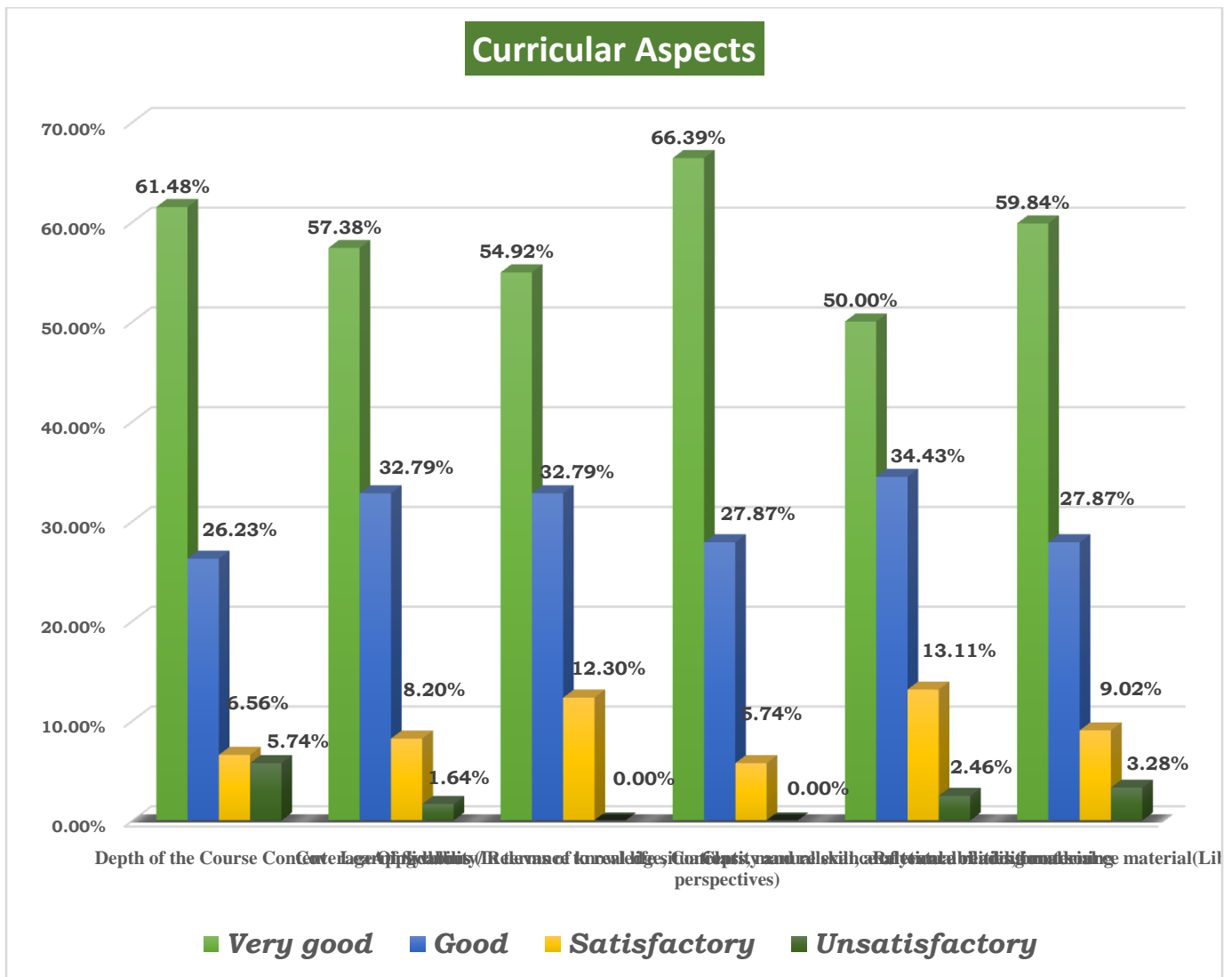
We carried out a survey to get suitable feedback on major aspects like curriculum, professional knowledge, practice and engagement of teachers, library resources and infrastructure, co-curricular programs, moral values, academic and non-academic programs of the college that develop the knowledge and skills.

Students handed back their suggestions and feedback during the PTA meeting. It is rated on a 4 point scale. A total of 400 students have taken up this survey. 77.38% have strongly expressed that Professional knowledge, Practice and Engagement of the faculty were the best. 43.12% of the students feel that buildings and class rooms, laboratories and infrastructure of the whole campus is good enough. Most of the students are satisfied with the clarity and relevance of the subject material.

Curricular Aspects

Among the elements of curricular aspects, learning values (in terms of knowledge, concepts, manual skills, analytical abilities, broadening perspectives) was rated to be excellent by the students. Students are extremely happy with depth and profundity of the course content. Most of the students are satisfied with relevance and availability of additional source material.

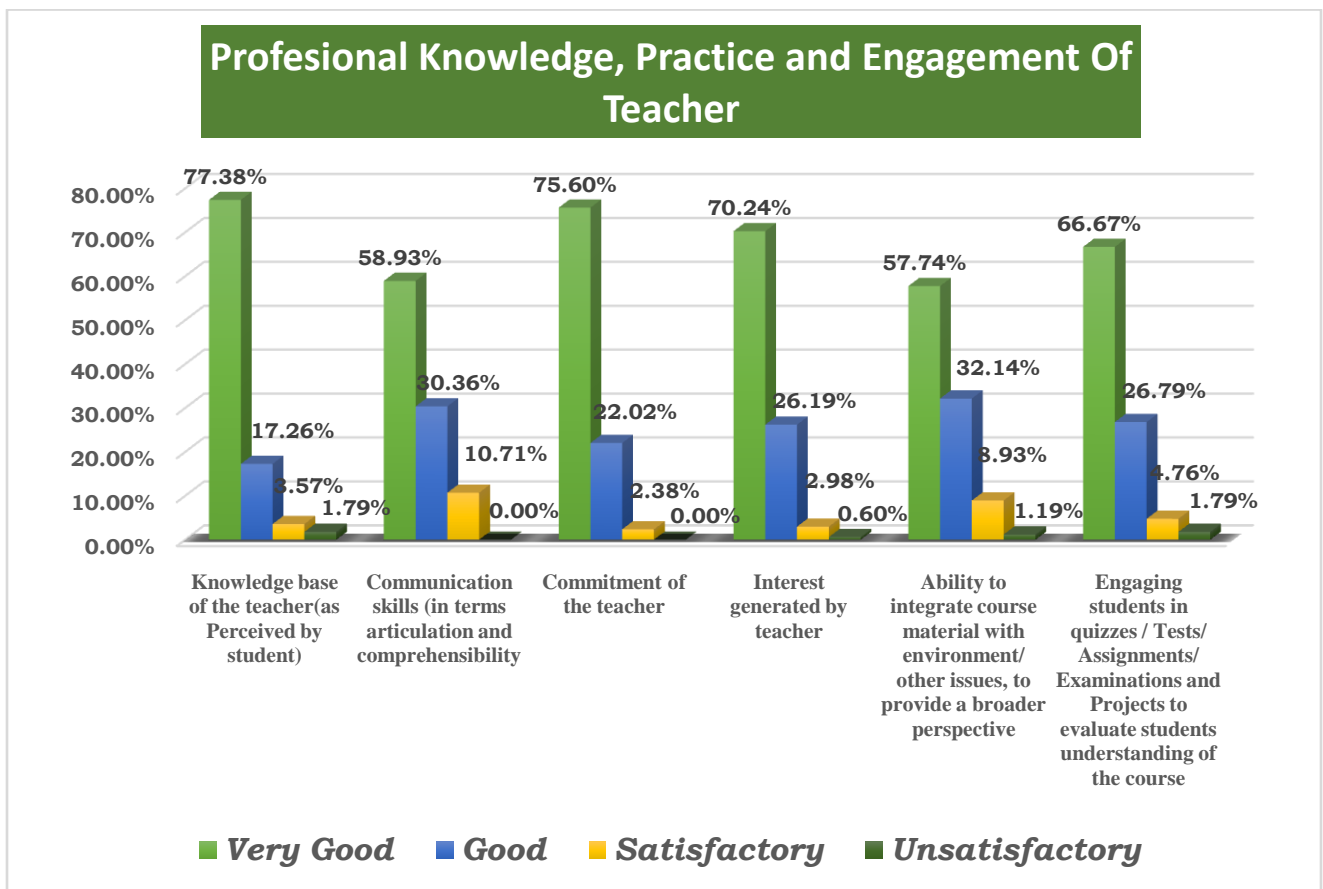
Fig. 1. Responses from students for curricular aspects

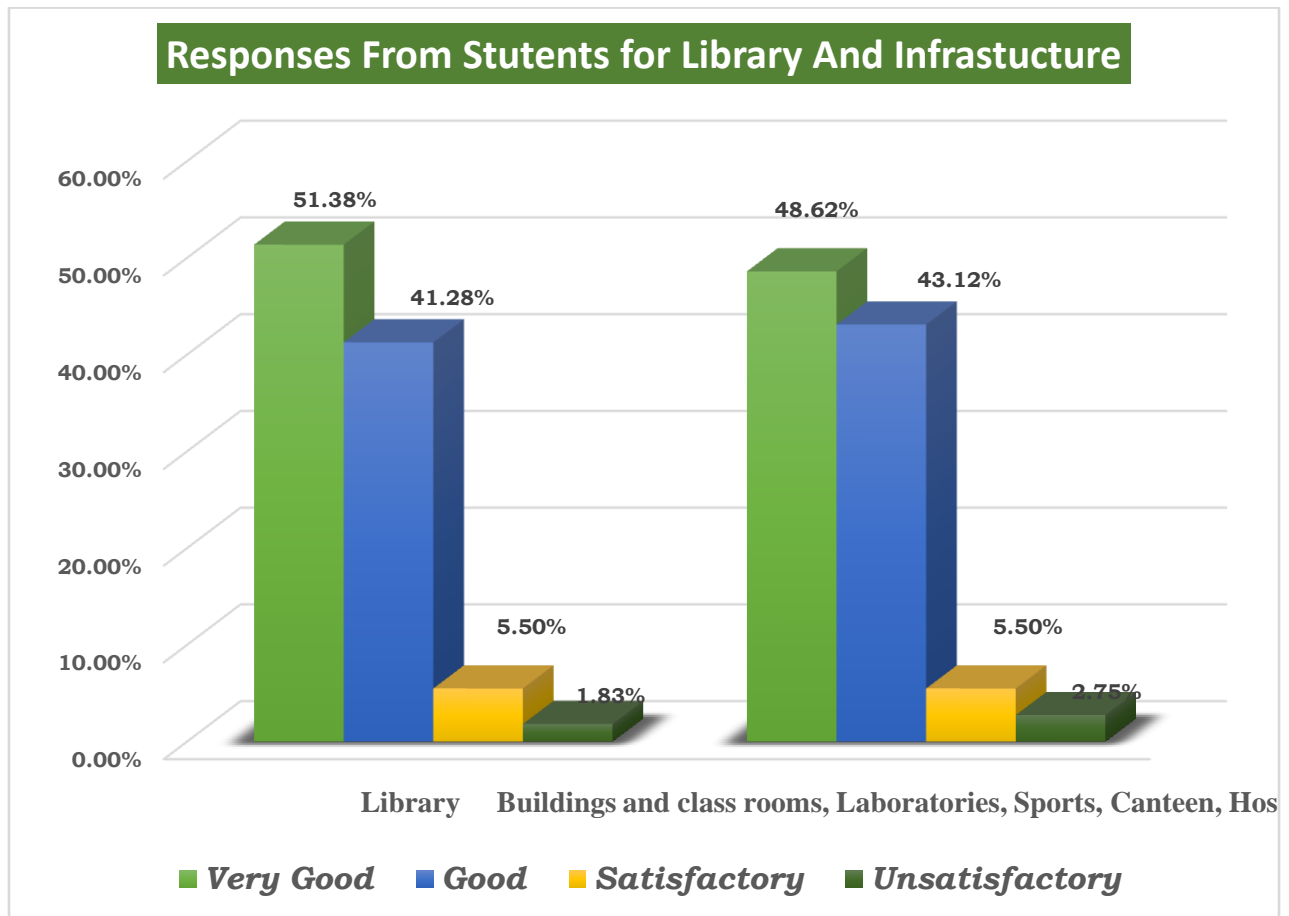
Fig. 2. Responses from students for Professional Knowledge, Practice and Engagement of Teachers
